Nō whea a Trust Waikato?

Nō whea te pūtea o Te Puna o Waikato? Nā te ture mātou i whakatū ai i te tau 1988 hei pupuru i ngā hea o Tarahiti Pēke Waikato. Nō te tau 1996 ka hokona katoatia ā mātou hea pēke ā, ka puta mai mātou i te mahi pēke. Mai i taua wā ka whakatikahia ai e Te Puna o Waikato tētehi kōpaki tāpae pūtea puta noa te ao, ā ko tētehi paihēneti e tukua ana ki ngā rōpū o te hapori huri noa te rohe.

He aha tō mātou kaupapa?

Mā te tuku pūtea āwhina ki ngā rōpū o te hapori te tautoko a Te Puna o Waikato i te whakahira ake i tō tātou rohe. He mea tautoko e mātou ngā rōpū me ngā kaupapa e hāngai ana ki te toko i te ora, te hākinakina, ngā mahi ā-rēhia, te hunga tamariki, te taiao, me te ahurea.

Ko tō mātou moemoea kia tipu, kia hua ngā hāpori.

Ko tō mātou whāinga kia tika te whakatipu rawa, ā, kia pai tōna tohatoha.

Ka tuku pūtea ki whea?

Ko tō mātou rohe tuku pūtea kei ngā takiwā o Thames/Coromandel, Hauraki, Matamata/Piako, Waipa, Waikato, South Waikato, Waitomo, Otorohanga, Ruapehu me te taonenui o Kirikiriroa.

E mārama ana Te Puna o Waikato ko te nuinga o ngā whenua o taua rohe nei nō Tainui waka arā, nō Waikato, Raukawa, Hauraki me Maniapoto.

Ka tuku pūtea ki a wai?

E tuku pūtea ana ki ngā rōpū o te hapori, kāore i te whai hua-arumoni:

- kei te rohe o Te Puna o Waikato te nuinga o ngā whakahaeretanga.
- he rōpū kua kaporeitia ā-ture hei tarahiti kaupapa atawhai.

(Me mārama mai: E taea tonutia ana te āwhina i te rōpū kāore i te pēnei te mana, whakapā mai ki tētehi o ō mātou Pouhere Pūtea.)

- e whai pūtea pēke ana, pūrongo tahua-ā-tau, me te pūrongo ā-tau o ā rātou whakahaerenga.

Where did Trust Waikato come from?

Ever wondered where Trust Waikato's money originated? We were established by government statute in 1988 to hold the shares of Trust Bank Waikato. In 1996 all our banking shares were sold and we exited the banking business. Since then the Trust has built up a global investment portfolio and donates a percentage of its profits to community organisations throughout the region.

What is our purpose?

Trust Waikato supports the things that make our corner of the world a better place by donating money to community organisations. Trust Waikato's funding supports organisations and projects that focus on welfare, sport, recreation, youth, environment and culture.

Our vision is for resilient and vibrant communities.

Our mission is to invest wisely, and donate effectively.

Where do we fund?

Our funding area includes the districts of Thames/Coromandel, Hauraki, Matamata/Piako, Waipa, Waikato, South Waikato, Waitomo, Otorohanga, Ruapehu and Hamilton city.

The Trust acknowledges that this area includes much of the lands of the Tainui waka and thus the people of Waikato, Raukawa, Hauraki and Maniapoto.

Who do we fund?

We fund not for profit community organisations that:

- operate predominantly within the Trust's geographic area.
- have an incorporated society or registered charitable trust status.
(Note: We can still fund organisations without this status; please talk to one of our Donation Advisors.)
- have a bank account, annual financial statements and annual report on their operations.

He mea nui whakaharahara ki Te Puna o Waikato me mārama te tangata nōna te hapori – mō ngā take mātauranga, mahi whaiutu, mahi ā-rēhia rānei.

Ko tā mātou he manaaki i te tautoko o te whai wāhi ki ngā take mātauranga, mahi ā-rēhia, me ngā mahi toi hoki, tae atu ana ki te whai wāhi i ngā whakatihia o te hapori me te ahurea.

Te manaaki tūao

He kaha te tautoko a Te Puna o Waikato i te āhua tūao o te mahi e whai painga ai o tātou hapori me ngā rōpū o roto. Ko tētehi tino kaupapa a Te Puna o Waikato he tautoko i te whakangungu me te manaaki i te hunga tūao me ā rātou takohatanga.

Te whakangao i te hapori pakari

He nui te tautoko a Te Puna o Waikato i ngā kaupapa, ngā hōtaka rānei e tiaki nā i te hunga kua aukatia i te ōrite o te kounga o te orange o te nuinga.

Kei ētahi hapori he hiahia motuhake – tērā pea nā te iti, te takiwā, te āhua o te tangata o reira – ā, he tautoko Te Puna o Waikato i ngā rōpū o te hapori e kaha nei te whakarato i ngā take kua tautuhitia. Hei tauira, e mōhio ana mātou ki ngā raruraru o te whai wāhi me ngā rori ki ngā hapori o te taiwhenua pāmamao.

He mahi ngātahi mātou me ngā rōpū whai taura here tūroa ki roto ki ngā hapori rawakore. Ērangi rawa ia, he tuku pūtea ki ngā rōpū whaiwhakaaro ki te whakawātea mōhiohio, para huarahi whai pūtea hoki ki ngā wāhi rawakore.

Ko te whakatika rawa mō te hapori, tūturu he ūpane whakatika orange mōna. He akiaki nā Te Puna o Waikato i ngā kura, ngā karapu hākinakina, ā-rēhia hoki ki te mahi ngātahi i ngā rawa me ngā rauhanganga me ka taea.

Building resilient communities

The Trust is keen to support projects or programmes provided for people who have been denied a quality of life enjoyed by the majority.

Some communities have distinct needs – perhaps because of their size, location or population characteristics – and the Trust supports community organisations working actively to service these needs in identified areas. For example, we are aware of the issues of access and transport faced by remote rural communities.

We work alongside organisations with established networks in communities experiencing high needs. In particular, the Trust funds broker organisations to facilitate access to information and funding opportunities in areas of high need.

Improving community resources is, literally, a building block towards improving social well-being for a community. The Trust encourages schools, sports and recreation clubs and community organisations to share resources and facilities where possible.

Strengthening community groups

Great work in the community requires strong and viable organisations. The Trust does fund the management and operational infrastructure of groups. We work alongside organisations to improve their capacity and sustainability. We encourage groups to use accountability and evaluation as a platform for learning.

Do we fund capital/building projects?

The Trust considers making contributions towards capital projects but does not fund entire project costs. It's important to have other funding partners when undertaking a major development. Make contact with our Donation Advisors early on in your planning to discuss the proposal.

What if your organisation receives Government funding?

Trust Waikato won't fund projects which are government's responsibility.

Organisations which receive significant government/local government support will generally only be eligible for reduced donations.

How can your organisation apply?

The Trust has two application forms and three donation rounds each year. There is a single-year application form and a multi-year application form.

Ka pēhea te pūtea e riro ai ki tō rōpū?

Kāore Te Puna o Waikato e tuku hūtea ka ea ai te katoa o te tono a te rōpū. He pai ki a mātou te tuku takoha taurite, me te whakahau i te rōpū ki te tono rōpū mai i ētahi atu puna pūtea.

Ka pēhea te here ki te tāke me te GST?

Kāore te tuku pūtea a Te Puna o Waikato e kume i te GST; kāore he take GST o ngā tukunga.

Ko tā mātou he whakahau i ngā rōpū kia rēhitatia rātou ki te IRD hei rōpū tāke-kore.

Tēnā pea ko tā tō rōpū he rehita me te Komihana Kaupapa Atawhai ka riro i a koutou te mana tāke-kore.

How much will your organisation get?

Trust Waikato rarely funds the entire sum that organisations request. We prefer to make a fair contribution and encourage organisations to secure funds from other sources as well.

What about tax status and GST?

Trust Waikato donations do not attract GST; donations are exempt from GST.

We encourage organisations to become recognised by the IRD as being tax exempt.

Your organisation may wish to register with the Charities Commission which will mean you are eligible for tax exempt status.

Can donations be for more than one year?

Trust Waikato also offers multi-year donations. If your organisation fits the multi-year donation criteria, you can apply for a 2 or 3 year commitment.

Ka pēhea te kawenga pūrongo?

Ko tā mātou whakaritenga me tuhi pūrongo e ngā rōpū mō tā rātou tono pūtea mutunga mō mua noa o te tono pūtea anō. Ka rua ngā huarahi e ea ai tēnei whakaritenga:

- 1) Mēnā e tono ana tō rōpū i tētehi pūtea anō, ka taea e koe te whakakī i te pātai kawenga pūrongo ki te pepatono, te tāpiri rānei i tētehi rāpopotonga i tō whakamahinga i te pūtea, me ngā hua i puta mō te haporī.
- 2) Mēnā, nāwai rā kāore tō rōpū e tono pūtea, me tuku mai tētehi pūrongo. Tuhia mai tētehi rāpopotonga i ngā hua i puta mai i te kaupapa mō te haporī. Tukuna mai hoki he kape o ngā rī hīti, me tētehi kape o te pūrongo tahua ā-tau.



Me taurite te rahi o tō kawenga pūrongo ki te rahi o te pūtea i tukua ki a koe.

Kei tō pūrongo mō tētehi atu tono ētehi whakaahua, kōrero nāu ake, ētehi pānui nūpepa rānei.

He aha te take i kore ai ētehi tono e whakaetia?

Tūturu, kāore ngā tono katoa e ea i te iti o te pūtea o Te Puna o Waikato. Ka whakamāramatia atu e mātou ngā take i kore ai tō tono e whakaetia. Ko ētehi o ngā take noa o mua:

Ngā pepatono kīhai i oti tika

Kīhai i tukuna e ngā kaitono te katoa e hiahiatia ana mai i te pepatono.

Ngā tono tōmuri

Kāore kau e taea e mātou te whai tono tūreiti. Kia kaha ki te tuku moata mai.

Te rārangi rawa

He pūtea anō kei ētehi rōpū e tārewa tonu ana te whāinga.

Ehara i te whāinga tōmua

Ko tā mātou he arotake i te kaupapa e whai painga nui atu ai te haporī. Kāore ā mātou rawa i te mutungakore, nō reira tērā pea ko ētehi tono ki tā mātou titiro he whāinga tōmuri kē atu i ētehi.

What about accountability?

We require organisations to report on their last donation before applying for another donation. There are two ways to go about this:

- 1) If your organisation is applying for another donation, you can fill out the accountability question on the application form, or attach a brief report on how you used the donation and how it benefited the community.
- 2) If your organisation is not applying for another donation for some time, it's best to send us a report. Include a project summary describing how the community benefited from your project. Please also provide copies of any receipts, as well as a set of annual financial statements.

TIP

Your accountability report should be relative to the size of your donation. Your report for a previous donation might also include photos, personal statements or media articles.

Why are some applications declined?

Unfortunately Trust Waikato's donation budget is never big enough to meet all requests. We will explain to your organisation the reason(s) why your application has been declined. The most common reasons for decline are:

Incomplete applications

Applicants have not supplied all that is requested on the form.

Late applications

We cannot receive applications after the closing date. Make sure you get them in early.

Level of reserves

Organisations have significant untagged funds in their accounts.

Low priority

We assess applications with an eye to giving money where the most community benefit will be derived. Our resources are limited which may mean we think certain requests are lower priorities than others.

Me aha ki te kore taku tonu ā-tau-anō e whakaaetia?

Me tūtaki e ngā tonu ā-tau-anō he paearu motuhake, kua tautuhitia ki tā mātou kaupapahere ā-tau-anō. Ki te kore tā tonu ā-tau-anō e whakaaetia, ka tirohia tonuhia tō tonu mō te tuku pūtea ki taua tau tonu ki taua wā tonu. Kāore he here ki tō rōpū kia tonu anō.

Projects or programmes that are unlikely to go ahead within the next twelve months.

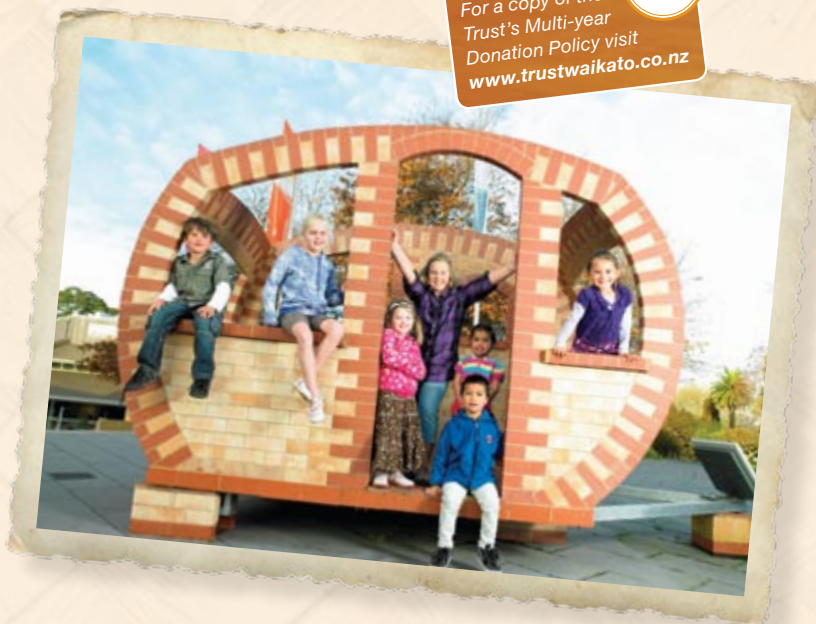
Outside policy

What happens if my multi-year application is declined?

Multi-year applications must meet some very specific criteria, as specified in our multi-year donation policy. If your multi-year application is declined, your application will still be assessed for an annual donation in the same round. Your organisation does not need to reapply.

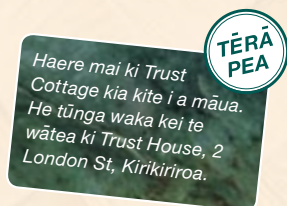
